








September Calls for Service Comparison




September Traffic Citation Comparison




September Collision Comparison





III: Items/Cases of Interest:

1. Met with Senior Staff in re to determining on how to streamline the Code Enforcement Program and have me develop a process which will best suit the needs for the community.
2. Received a complaint from Beaufort County in re to possible violations involving land, zoning, property use and sanitary issues. This case is being investigated.
3. Received and addressed a complaint in re to an unlicensed business which may be selling Mexica food the back of their vehicles and preparing them in an establishment not DHEC regulated and the scope of their Business License is to only sell food as a market.
4. Received and additional list of Businesses whom are delinquent or owe back taxes. Also conducting proactive approaches to help identify businesses operating within the Town without TOB Business Licenses.
5. Reviewed and discussed the requirements of Town of Bluffton Business Licenses required during special events pursuant to code. This is being monitored and educational methods have taken place.
6. Working on gaining voluntary compliance from two Developments in violation to the Town's Storm water and Erosion control methods. We were able to get one development to full compliance, while we are still working on the other.
7. Addressed and addressing numerous properties where I have received complaints in re to them being a public health nuisance. I made site visits and verified whether they were or were not in violation. Each case was handled with little to no resistance. Some cases are still pending.
8. Completed proactive patrols of new development sites to ensure all proper entities were in compliance with the plans submitted to the Town and reviewed by our Development Review Committee.
9. Received and addressed a few complaints received by Senior Staff and am working with the big developments and property owners to come to an agreeable solution for all parties.


