








September Calls for Service Comparison




September Traffic Citation Comparison




September Collision Comparison





CONCERNS VOICED BY THE COMMUNITY: (CALEA 45.2.2a)

Tabby Roads HOA (September 2nd, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

Spoke with Tabby Roads HOA President about ongoing issues in the community. Provided some answers and recommended asking an officer to join the next community meeting.

Alive @ 25 (September 2nd, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU taught and spoke with 36 students of the Alive @ 25 Class. Alive at 25 is a survival course developed by the National Safety Council and is designed to prevent the #1 killer of teens, automobile crashes. Alive at 25 is taught by Deputy Sheriffs and Municipal Police Officers. The course is delivered in one 4.5 hour program which focuses on the behaviors and decision-making paradigms that young drivers and passengers display behind the wheel. Instructors hold candid conversations with students about what can happen if they practice risky behavior or make other poor decisions in an automobile.

United States Marshal Service (September 3rd, 2015)

NSU Officer assigned to US Marshals SERTF team assisted in the service of warrants for a Tavarus Coney who was located on Hilton Head Island. Coney was located and arrested without incident and transported to BCDC awaiting extradition to Bibb County, Georgia.
