








November Calls for Service Comparison




November Traffic Citation Comparison




November Collision Comparison




November Burglary Comparison




November Theft Comparison




November Domestic Calls for Service Comparison



November Arrest Comparison




November Assault Comparison



NSU REPORTS OF INTEREST:

15BP41422 – PWITD Cocaine, Poss. of Controlled Substance, Drug Paraphernalia

A traffic stop for a speeding violation on Buck Island Road and Tower Road resulted in the driver, Rachel Taddonio to be in constructive possession of drug paraphernalia (spoon with drug residue) and a schedule IV controlled substance (Xanax). The passenger, Bradley Bellamy was found to be in constructive possession of a schedule IV controlled substance (Xanax) and in possession of cocaine base and drug paraphernalia (crack pipe).

15BP41066 – DUS & Poss. of Marijuana

A traffic stop for turning left on a red light out of Buckwalter Place onto Buckwalter Pkwy resulted in the drivers, Tykeema Claray Abram, being in possession of marijuana. Officers located two baggies of marijuana in her purse weighing approx. 5.5 grams. She was also found not to have valid driver's license which was currently under suspension.

15BP40386 – PWITD Controlled Substance x2, PWITD Within 1/2 mile of school x4, Poss. of Controlled Substance x3, Trafficking Heroin, Poss. of stolen Firearm x2, and Poss. of firearm during a violent crime.

NSU officers observed a Tyrique Scott, who had multiple outstanding arrest warrants on file, sitting in a black Dodge Ram at 170 Buck Island Road. Officers attempted to make contact with Scott who fled from the vehicle on foot. A foot chase ensued through several properties and observed Scott hide a black/blue bag underneath of a house on Buck Island Road. Multiple officers converged on the location and Scott was apprehended. Officers recovered the bag and found Scott to be in possession of 205 grams of marijuana, 357.50 Alprazolam (Xanax) pills, 79 Hydrocodone pills, 32.68 grams of heroin and two stolen handguns.

15BP40411 – Reckless Driving, No SCDL, & Improper Display

A traffic stop was conducted on a silver Honda Fit on US 278 W at Dillon Road. The vehicle was traveling westbound at a high rate of speed. The vehicle's speed at 97 mph in a posted 45 mph zone. Driver, Brenda Guerrero was arrested for reckless driving, no driver's license and displaying a vehicle registration belonging to a different vehicle.

15BP40608 – Poss. of Marijuana & Drug Parphernalia

On November 18, 2015 at 2017 hours, a traffic stop at Shults and Goethe Roads was conducted on a silver sedan (SC Plate: 414-8EJ) for speeding 41 mph in a 30 mph zone. The driver, Patrick Finn was found to be in possession of approx. 4 grams of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.

II: Cases of Interest:

1. I addressed 21 business license complaints this month that were either delinquent or operating within the town of Bluffton without a Town Business License.
2. I received a complaint from our Stormwater Division in re to violations taking place in Alston Park. Staff and I met with representatives concerning the violation and were able to gain voluntary compliance along with educating them on proper procedures.



3. I received a complaint in re to China Wok illicitly discharging grease in their catch basin behind their business. This was verified and immediate mitigation was ordered. They were advised of the violation and educated on proper procedures.
4. Developed and worked on a code enforcement streamlining process between Town Hall and the Police Department in order to help educate the public and community in order to gain voluntary compliance. This process is still in the works and the approval of a written Notice of Violation form has been developed and approved.
5. Met with Town Staff and worked on developing a window decal business license policy for further implementation and approval for applicable businesses.
6. Received a complaint from our Stormwater Division in re to possible stormwater issues concerning a project on Buck Island Road. This issue was addressed and we were able to receive voluntary compliance through education.
7. Received numerous complaints from the liaison from Shell Hall Plantation in re to noise complaints and possible business infraction in violation of our Muni-code. I was able to locate the owner of the business and address the concerns of the public. I was able to educate him on our code and have not received any violations to date.
8. I received a complaint in re to possible violations concerning the Bluffton Room in the Promenade. This case is still being addressed in the regulatory stages.
9. I attended all DRC meetings and educated all Developers, Builders and Contractors on the difference between paying for services via Form 1099 vs Form W2 employees and which type require the need for a Town Business Licenses.
10. I also worked on a letter to be distributed to all applicable businesses as part of our ongoing educational process to company's concerning their needs for Town Business licenses. This form is still on the approval stages.
