


July 2015 Heat Maps



CONCERNS VOICED BY THE COMMUNITY: (CALEA 45.2.2a)

Speed Trailer Shell Hall (July 1st, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU deployed the speed trailer in Shell Hall Planation after receiving complaints from the HOA about subjects speeding through the neighborhood.

Independence Day Parade Calhoun St. (July 4th, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU assisted with traffic control for the parade on Calhoun St. ending over at Dubois Park. Officers then spent time speaking and playing with the kids at the park.

Alcohol Enforcement (July 3rd, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

Officers made random checks at numerous local establishments in Bluffton that serve alcohol. One underage violation found with subject using a fake ID from Florida.

Speed Trailer Wellstone (July 7th, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU deployed the speed trailer in Wellstone Planation after receiving complaints from the HOA about subjects speeding through the neighborhood.

US Marshal's Task Force (July 16th, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU officers assigned part-time to the US Marshal Task Force, apprehended Tyrique Scott wanted by the Bluffton Police Dept. for numerous drug violation, including PWITD and Trafficking.



Mayor's Tour of Bluffton (July 16th, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU officers assigned in Mayor's tour of Bluffton to include traffic control.

Alcohol Enforcement (July 17th, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

Officers made random checks at numerous local establishments in Bluffton that serve alcohol. No violations were found.

Assist Another Agency (July 28th, 2015)

(CALEA 45.1.3)

NSU assisted Beaufort County Sheriff's Office, responding to an armed robbery at the Tanger Outlets at the Under Armor store. Possibly suspect was identified during this time.

POTENTIAL PROBLEMS THAT HAVE A BEARING ON LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES: (CALEA 45.2.2b)

The following complaints were received by patrol completing their assigned Community Contacts:

1. Westbury Business Park / Speeding Complaints

Spoke to Steve Anderson via telephone. No new concerns but reported that there are still speeding issues through Westbury Business Park.

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS ON IDENTIFIED CONCERNS AND PROBLEMS: (CALEA 45.2.2c)

1. Speed trailer is scheduled to be deployed during the first week in August. Patrol notified to increase patrols in the area for speeding violations.

PROGRESS ON PRIOR IDENTIFIED CONCERNS AND PROBLEMS (CALEA 45.2.2d) -

1. Hallmark Apartments: Loitering in Parking lot and Gazebo areas.

Extra-patrols were completed by the patrol division, showing a strong law enforcement presence. No further complaints have been received by management.

2. Sunoco; Loitering at night, especially at closing time.

Officers made an attempt to be in the parking lot, while store employees were leaving at closing time. No loitering of individuals was observed.





3. Wellstone; Individuals loitering in undeveloped area. Extra-patrol was assigned and based on reports, no violations were found. Extra patrols will continue for next few months to ensure compliance.

15BP23161 - SPOM, Pass. of Drug Para and Service of Bench Warrant
 NSU officers conducted a traffic stop for an improper turn, finding the driver to be in possession of 4.5 grams of marijuana and a black digital scale. The passenger, Jaquan Greene was found to active bench warrants on file. Both were transported to the Beaufort County Detention Center.

15BP23051 - Minor in Possession of Alcohol, Possession of Fake ID
 NSU officers were conducting area checks of local alcohol establishments finding a, Leah Wade, to be consuming liquor. Wade was only 19 years of age, having a fake Florida license, showing her to be 21 years of age. Wade stated she purchased the fake ID in Columbia, SC for sixty dollars and just wanted to have some fun with her friends tonight at The Old Town Dispensary.

15BP23981 - SPOM, Drug Paraphernalia
 NSU officers conducted a traffic stop for turn signal violation, finding the driver, Timothy Neitzel, to be in possession of 3 grams of marijuana and two marijuana pipes.

15BP24792 – Fugitive Arrest Warrant, Trafficking Meth, PWITD Sch. II, PWITD Sch. IV
 NSU officers who are assigned part-time to the US Marshals were conducting surveillance on a Tyrique Scott. Scott had outstanding warrants with the Bluffton Police Dept. for Trafficking Meth and numerous other narcotics charges. During surveillance, Scott was observed as a rear seat passenger of a vehicle on Simmonsville Rd. A traffic stop was made, apprehending Scott. The front seat passenger, Sherrod Green, fled from the vehicle and warrants have been obtained for his arrest.



15BP26103 – SPOM, Drug Paraphernalia
 NSU officers conducted a traffic stop for a speeding violation, identifying the driver as a Dominic Ransburg. Officers detected an odor of raw marijuana emitting from the vehicle. 6.5 grams of marijuana and a glass pipe was located.

July 6th, 2015 / 53 Persimmon Street

P.P.I. is collecting trash from time shares and storing it in a trailer on the property of the HOA. Agreement to remove trash and stop the storage of it on the property was made.

July 6th, 2015 / 4380 Bluffton Parkway

Timeless Interiors have rented out a portion of their warehouse to a company by the name of BuiltMart. BuiltMart was found not to have a Town of Bluffton business license and was issued a warning ticket. They were educated on how to obtain their license, being in compliance.

July 6th, 2015 / 20 Sable Drive, Illegal dumping

The party responsible for the dumping was located and a warning ticket was issued. The subject resides in the Haven and thought that she can throw her trash near a business's dumpster.

July 9th 2015 / Hampton Lakes Construction

Illegal Discharge of paint into drains, no business license. Two warnings issued. (Guanchias Painting).
