Bluffton Rotary Walk for Water

Whereas, the community of Miramar, Peru, consisting of 2,800 people, is lacking a clean water source, and whose water is contaminated causing illnesses that prevent the people of the community from attending school or work; and

Whereas, we live on the beautiful May River where we see firsthand the importance of clean water, and the Bluffton Rotary Club saw the need and committed to making a difference in Miramar by applying for and receiving a grant from Rotary International to fund a portion of the clean water project and the work, which is nearly complete; and

Whereas, with a completion date of early fall, a Walk for Water will take place on September 24th at the Oyster Factory Park to finalize the funds needed for completion; and

Whereas, people in third world countries typically walk 3.5 miles to get water that we would not consider drinking, walkers will begin at the Oyster Factory Park, walk one mile, fill up a bucket of water and then return a mile to the May River at the Oyster Factory Park; and

Whereas, the walk will not only bring the Bluffton community together in unity for a wonderful cause, but will also bring awareness of the importance of clean water in our community and worldwide.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that I Lisa Sulka, Mayor of the Town of Bluffton, along with Bluffton Town Council, do hereby recognize that clean water is essential to the quality of life and express appreciation to the Bluffton Rotary Club for conducting such a meaningful international project.
