








August Calls for Service Comparison




August Traffic Citation Comparison




August Collision Comparison








August 2015 Heat Maps



15BP28859 – Unlawful Carrying of a Firearm and Open Container

NSU officers conducted a stop on a suspicious person, sitting in their vehicle of the Dollar General parking lot. Officers observed an open container in plain view. Search incident to arrest, officers located a fully loaded firearm underneath the seat, "ready at hand". Subject was arrested and transported to the Beaufort County Jail.

15BP29304 –Assisting Another Agency and Fleeing to Evade Arrest

NSU officers had previous knowledge that Thomas Bush had outstanding warrants on file with BCSO for Family Court. NSU officers observed Thomas Bush on Goethe Rd., assisting BCSO with a traffic stop. Thomas Bush fled from the vehicle, with the vehicle also fleeing the area, which caused a pursuit to ensue. Bluffton Police terminated the pursuit, due to excessive speeds, high traffic, and for the safety of the citizens of Bluffton.
