

## **Town of Bluffton's Deputy Town Manager Scott Marshall Credentialed by International Local Government Management Organization**

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Scott Marshall, the Town of Bluffton's deputy town manager, recently received the Credentialed Manager designation from ICMA, the International City/County Management Association. Marshall is one of more than 1,400 local government management professionals currently credentialed through the ICMA Voluntary Credentialing Program.

ICMA's mission is to create excellence in local governance by promoting professional management worldwide and increasing the proficiency of appointed chief administrative officers, assistant administrators, and other employees who serve local governments and regional entities around the world. The organization's nearly 10,000 members in 27 countries also include educators, students, and other local government employees.

To receive the prestigious ICMA credential, a member must have significant experience as a senior management executive in local government; have earned a degree, preferably in public administration or a related field; and demonstrated a commitment to high standards of integrity and to lifelong learning and professional development.

Prior to joining the Town of Bluffton in 2015, Marshall worked within Beaufort County since 2009. Marshall was Beaufort County's former director of parks and leisure services (PALS) and also served as the executive director of Beaufort County Board of Election of Registration.

Prior to serving in local and regional government positions, Marshall served 23 years as an Air Force officer as a nuclear weapons technician, a substance abuse counselor and a personnel officer.

Marshall earned a master's degree in public administration with a concentration in human resources from American Public University. He also earned a bachelor's degree in political science and psychology from Eastern Michigan University with a minor in military science.
