








May Calls for Service Comparison




May Traffic Citation Comparison




May Collision Comparison





III: Items/Cases of Interest:

1. Addressed many complaints in re to political and other issues in re to prohibited signs that have been placed all throughout Town.
2. Worked with the Business License Division on instituting an SOP on how to handle business license complaints/compliance.
3. Conducted monthly business site checks to verify if they were located at their current listed addresses or if they have moved and did not report it to the Business License Department or if they have moved. In addition I conducted follow-up on a business checks and met with new builders and advised them of the Town Business License Requirements.
4. Addressed and addressing numerous poperies where I have received complaints in re to them being a public health nuisance. I prepared letters and sent them for approval and dissemination.
5. Received and addressed an influx of complaints in re to prohibited dewatering operations taking place outside permitted hours. Worked with all Project Managers for the new developments and have not received further complaints.
6. Received and addressed illicit discharge complaints and worked closely with our Stormwater Division to ensure compliance.
7. Completed proactive patrols of new development sites to ensure all proper entities were in compliance with the plans submitted to the Town and reviewed by our Development Review Committee.
8. Found prohibited signage that was posted in right-of ways advertising for business that were not licensed to operate within the Town. I made contact with them and advised them on how to obtain their business license and advised them of the sign regulations.
9. Received and addressed a few complaints received by Senor Staff and am working with the big developments and property owners to come to an agreeable solution for all parties.
