








June Calls for Service Comparison




June Traffic Citation Comparison




June Collision Comparison




June Burglary Comparison




June Theft Comparison




June Domestic Calls for Service Comparison



June Assault Comparison




June Arrest Comparison



III: Items/Cases of Interest:

1. Received a complaint in re to possible homeless camps being stretched along Simmonsville Road between the jurisdictions of Beaufort County and the Town of Bluffton. I addressed the issue with the County and working with Officers and Staff on taking proactive measures to prevent this from occurring.
2. Received and addressed with Stormwater Techs in re to whole developments being in violations of not having proper BMP's for Erosion and Sediment prevention. NOV's have been issued and compliance has been received.
3. Conducted monthly business site checks to verify if they were located at their current listed addresses or if they have moved and did not report it to the Business License Department or if they have moved. In addition I conducted follow-up on a business checks and met with new builders and advised them of the Town Business License Requirements.
4. Addressed and addressing numerous properties where I have received complaints in re to them being a public health nuisance. I made site visits and verified whether they were or were not in violation. Each case was handled with little to no resistance. Some cases are still pending.
5. Received and addressed additional complaints in re to prohibited dewatering operations taking place outside permitted hours. After numerous warnings and conference calls, I cited one on site supervisor who acknowledged he was wrong.
6. Addressed many complaints in re to political and other issues in re to prohibited signs that have been placed all throughout Town.
7. Completed proactive patrols of new development sites to ensure all proper entities were in compliance with the plans submitted to the Town and reviewed by our Development Review Committee.
8. Received and addressed a few complaints received by Senor Staff and am working with the big developments and property owners to come to an agreeable solution for all parties.
9. Also received a few complaints in re to littering on private property. I explained the Town's procedures and how we handle those types of cases. No case had any viable leads to follow-up on.
